SATURDAY BOTTOMLESS BRUNCH TERMS & CONDITIONS

Dim Sum Saturday Brunch is available at Ping Pong Soho, St Katharine Docks & Southbank only.

Each £37.50 and £42.50 bottomless brunch package comes with a dim sum set menu per person, which can be chosen between Original or Vegan and Made Without Gluten. Dim Sum items may vary according to availability; all items not available will be replaced with a suitable alternative. Bottomless Drinks Offer is to be chosen between the £37.50 and £42.50 packages; all guests at the table must choose the same package in order to enjoy the bottomless drinks offer.

We want you to have as much fun as possible complying with the Licensing Act 2003. This means we need to ensure you stay in a euphoric state and avoid becoming drunk, vulnerable, or behaving irresponsibly. Wine, Bubbly, and Beer will be topped up from your server one at a time. Cocktails will initially be served to the table at half carafe per person; thereafter, they will be topped up by the server individually, by the glass, upon request once your glass is empty. Alcohol is served at the manager's discretion. This offer is subject to availability; Ping Pong management reserves the right to amend or terminate the offer at any time.

As license holders at licensed premises, we are obliged to promote responsible drinking. Unfortunately, Bottomless Promotions offered over a fixed time period may be perceived as promoting irresponsible drinking, as they incentivize drinking more than usual or attempting to consume as much as possible within the time frame. Licensing Officers require us to be more stringent when serving customers during bottomless offers. Instead of cutting you off once you are "Drunk" (stage 3 of intoxication), we must ensure that you do not surpass "Euphoria" (stage 2 of intoxication). Therefore, we may ask you to slow down your rate of drinking and encourage you to eat and drink water if we feel that your consumption is on the high side and may have an adverse impact on your intoxication. If your consumption rate remains high, we may slow the rate of service to you or even temporarily suspend it.

Should you, despite all efforts, reach stage 3 of intoxication (become drunk), you will be refused service until you sober up. However, you will be offered complimentary water, rice, and coffee to assist with that.

It is important to note that your group cannot share their drinks with you if you have been asked to slow down, if your service has been intentionally slowed down, or temporarily suspended. Doing so would violate Licensing Laws and may result in actions being taken (such as a warning, temporary service suspension for the group, being asked to pay the bill and vacate, or even involving the police to deal with this offense). It is an offense to provide alcohol to someone who has been refused service or is underage.

Some people may naturally be good at masking the effects of alcoholic intoxication. This is why we may need to rely on the quantity or rate of consumption to determine whether a slowdown or temporary suspension may be required.

Everyone's rate of alcohol metabolism is different, and there are many other factors affecting one's rate of intoxication (such as sex, size, and ethnicity). Therefore, we cannot provide an indication of how many units or drinks are okay to consume. However, consuming more than 6 units of alcohol for women and more than 8 units for men is considered binge drinking.
